Call to Order

- February 3 Meeting Minutes approved

Discussion Items:

- Counseling Center Update
 - 1. 9th grade career unit in Language Arts is forthcoming and then one-on-one meetings with all 9th graders will occur
 - 2. Next year's Tiger Squad has many members returning from this year!
 - 3. Our school will be participating in September's "Out-of-the-Darkness" suicide awareness walk. We participated in it last year as well.
 - 4. Question: If my 9th grader takes Earth Science instead of Biology, Mountain Ridge is saying they will also be required to take Physics and Chemistry.
 - Answer: Students must take two core sciences (Biology, Chemistry, Physics) and one elective (Earth Science, Human Anatomy, Animal Science, Astronomy, etc.) totalling three. So Earth Science would meet the elective requirement.
- Discussion regarding Uber food and drink deliveries to students during school
 - 1. Deliveries have increased from five-10 per week to 50 per week.
 - 2. Parents are also dropping food off to their students during times outside of lunch.
 - 3. Community Council came up with a policy that students' food would be held in the office *only to* be picked up during their assigned lunch period. All members voted to approve the new policy.
 - 4. A Sky Alert explaining the new policy on Sunday night and the students will hear about it on the announcements on Friday right before the end of school.
- Discussion regarding Teacher Advisory Period (currently 1st period) T.A.
 - 1. What are the logistics? Rather, what is the school trying to accomplish during T.A.?
 - 2. Currently we work on social/emotional learning during this time. In the past the days were split between interventions and social/emotional learning lessons.
 - 3. One member explained Ft. Herriman's model.
 - 4. Mr. Grothe explained that our teachers have been given the opportunity to come up with ideas to present to the faculty. He will also present an idea and there will be a vote. Whatever is chosen needs to be supported by the faculty 100%.
 - 5. If we try something new we can revisit it prior to Christmas Break and see how it's working.
