Academic Information

Proficiency-Based Learning

We will be using proficiency scales to assess student learning on “power standards” across all content areas on a scale of 1 to 4 (1 being ‘Below Proficient’ and 4 being ‘Above Proficient’).

How will grades be determined?

Assessments will make up 80% of an academic grade and will reflect the student’s proficiency level on particular standards. Academic practice will make up the remaining 20% of an academic grade. In the event students do not demonstrate proficiency, they may retake assessments based on teachers’ expectations outlined in their disclosure statements. Letter grades will be determined on the following basis:

A = 3.5 - 4

B = 2.8 - 3.49

C = 2.0 - 2.79

D = 1.00 - 1.99

F = 0 - .9

Quarter-End Deadlines

Assignments and assessments must be submitted by the Tuesday before the end of the quarter.

- 1st Quarter: Tuesday, October 13, 2026
- 2nd Quarter: Tuesday, January 12, 2027
- 3rd Quarter: Tuesday, March 23, 2027
- 4th Quarter: Tuesday, June 1, 2027

Late Work Policy

- Teachers will clearly inform students of due dates.
- Late assignments, if completed, will not be penalized and will receive the grade earned depending on the accuracy and quality of the work.
- It is the student’s responsibility to ensure that assignments and assessments are completed by the due dates.

Make-Up Work Policy

- Students are responsible for obtaining assignments missed due to absences.
- Students may turn in late work without penalty during a unit.
- Students may retake an assessment based on teachers' expectations outlined in their disclosure statements.

Skyward

- Parents and students should check Skyward regularly
- Grades should be updated weekly
- Parents can update emergency contact information on Skyward
- To access Skyward, go to southhills.jordandistrict.org and click on 'Gradebook', or go to www.jordandistrict.org and click on 'Parents and Students', then 'Family Access (Skyward)', and then choose your web browser access.

Both parents and students will receive a Skyward log-in ID and password in order to view current grades, missing assignments, attendance information, and additional information. Both IDs and passwords will be mailed home at the beginning of the school year. Please see the JSD link for [Family Skyward Access](#).

Academic Integrity

Students are expected to demonstrate the TIGER Traits and adhere to characteristics of Portrait of a Graduate when they need help with learning or schoolwork.

- Do your own work
 - Schoolwork (assignments, projects, tests, or assessments) is to help students learn or to demonstrate what they know.
 - Unless for teacher-approved group or lab work, or collaborative schoolwork, students must complete work on their own.
- Cite sources
 - When using an idea or statement (whether written or stated), give credit appropriately.
 - Use of words, ideas, or statements of others without use of citation is plagiarism.
- Use A.I. appropriately
 - Complete assignments within teacher-approved guidelines of A.I.
 - If not sure, ask the teacher what is or is not an acceptable use of A.I.
- Plan ahead and take responsibility
 - If a signature or document is needed for a schoolwork, field trip, or other school assignment or activity, make sure to get any approval you need from a parent/guardian ahead of time.
 - Producing a copy or falsely creating a signature or document to deceive another person or group into believing it is authentic, is forgery.

- Use only teacher-approved materials (notes, cards, etc.) on quizzes, tests, and assessments.
- Respect testing rules and procedures

Students who engage in actions that conflict with academic integrity (TIGER Traits or the characteristics of Portrait of a Graduate) may be subject to the following actions:

- A zero (0) for the work
- Develop a plan for completing the work
- Complete an alternate assignment or assessment
- Drop in Citizenship grade
- School discipline

Attendance

It is important that students make every effort to attend school. Activities, discussions, simulations, and presentations occur daily and cannot always be duplicated even through after-school instruction or make-up work.

Parents/Guardians are responsible for notifying the school of excused absences. Excused absences may include: illness, medical appointment, bereavement, court appearance, emergency, pre-approved educational leave, and a unique family/religious event.

Attendance Responsibilities

The role of the school administration includes:

- Identify students with attendance issues and work cooperatively with parents and students to improve attendance.
- Make an earnest and persistent effort to improve student attendance.
- Notify parents of excessive absenteeism by phone message, email, or letter.

The role of the attendance office includes:

- Keep the school administration and parents informed of attendance issues.
- Review daily attendance and resolve discrepancies..

The role of the teacher includes:

- Keep an accurate roll of all absences and tardies.
- Emphasize the importance of punctuality by beginning class promptly with meaningful instruction.
- Discuss attendance issues with students as they arise and inform the school administration if attendance does not improve.

The role of the student includes:

- Gain the most of their educational experience by regularly attending and being on time for all classes.
- Present in assigned or designated areas at all times.
- Follow proper check-in/check-out procedures.
- Obtain make-up assignments from the teacher due to an absence.

The role of the parent includes:

- Support student learning by expecting regular school attendance.
- Excuse verified absences in a timely manner via Skyward or the attendance office.
- Be mindful of the school calendar as you plan verified absences.

Attendance Policy

School success starts with attendance. Our students need to be in school to afford them the greatest likelihood of academic and social success. As part of a team effort to help our students build connections, develop healthy habits and behaviors, and increase their motivation to be in school, South Hills Middle School implements the Attendance Policy outlined below:

Tardy

Tardy marks in any class will negatively impact a student's Citizenship Grade for that class, which may impact the student's eligibility to attend field trips, dances and assemblies.

- Students must be in their assigned seats when the tardy bell rings.
- Students who are not in their assigned seat when the tardy bell rings will be marked 'Tardy' (T).
- With every fifteen (15) tardies, students must attend a study session on Thursdays from 3:10 pm to 3:50 pm.
- Failure to attend a study session may result in being assigned the Tiger Intervention Room (ISS) or out-of-school suspension.

Way Late

Way Late marks in any class will negatively impact a student's Citizenship Grade for that class, which may impact the student's eligibility to attend field trips, dances and assemblies.

- Students who arrive to class more than 10 minutes after the bell will be marked with a 'Way Late' (W) on their attendance record.
- With every ten (10) Way Late marks, students must attend a study session.
- Failure to attend a study session may result in being assigned the Tiger Intervention Room (ISS) or out-of-school suspension.
- Way Late marks in any single class will negatively impact the Citizenship Grade for that class.

Truancy

Truancy marks in any class will negatively impact a student's Citizenship Grade for that class, which may impact the student's eligibility to attend field trips, dances and assemblies.

- Students who leave campus during class or intentionally miss more than 20 minutes of a class will be marked 'Truant' (Z).
- Please note that parents cannot excuse students for leaving campus without the proper check-out procedures.
- For every three (3) truancy marks, students must attend a study session.
- Failure to attend a study session will result in being assigned to the Tiger Intervention room (ISS) or an out-of-school suspension.

Study Session

Students with poor attendance marks as outlined above must attend a study session.

Study sessions will be held:

- Thursdays from 3:10 pm to 3:50 pm

Study Session Expectations

- Cell phones must be turned in
- Students will not talk or socialize
- Students must remain seated
- Use of chromebooks must be related to academic use only (no gaming)

Students who choose not to comply with the expectations will be dismissed from the study session and assigned to the Tiger Intervention Room (ISS) or an out-of-school suspension.

Home and Hospital

When a doctor orders a student to be out of school for over ten school days, a parent or guardian must contact the counseling center to arrange Home and Hospital instruction. The doctor's note must be provided to the counseling center before Home and Hospital instruction can begin.

Withdrawal from School

When students move outside the school boundaries, they need to withdraw from South Hills.

This process includes completing the following:

- Withdrawal Form from the attendance office
- Returning chromebook and any school books (textbooks, media center, etc.)
- Cleaning out lockers
- Paying fines/fees

Failure to complete these steps may result in delay or denial of credit.

General Information

Assemblies

Behave respectfully and appropriately during assemblies. This includes standing/showing respect during the National Anthem/Pledge of Allegiance, sitting where assigned, paying attention to the presenter, participating in a manner appropriate for the assembly, and leaving electronic devices out of sight. Students failing to meet these expectations may be removed from the assembly and are subject to school discipline.

District Bus Transportation

A student qualifies for district bus transportation if the student lives two miles or more from the school and is not on a permit. Students must board the bus at the regular stops. Students are expected to follow the bus driver's directions. Misbehavior on the bus may lead to school consequences, including the revocation of district bus transportation.

School Lunch / Breakfast

Parents may add money to their student's account via Skyward with a debit or credit card. Money deposited in this way is immediately available to the student to purchase food in the cafeteria. Cashiers cannot accept checks.

Students may add money to their account by completing a lunch deposit slip in the main office before 9:30am. Money deposited after 9:30am will not be reflected in their account until the next business day. Students may also pay for a lunch with cash as they go through the lunch line.

Vending machines are available and are to be used at students' own risk. South Hills will not reimburse students for money lost in these machines.

Cafeteria Expectations

Disrespectful behavior such as leaving trays, climbing over tables, throwing food, cutting in line, or horseplay may result in school discipline.

Electronic Device Policy

Students are encouraged to leave electronic devices (personal laptops, computers, tablets, game systems, music players, and other devices or toys) at home. Cell phones (including headphones and smart watches) are welcome at school during lunch and passing periods.

Cell phones and/or headphones must be out of sight during class time (bell-to-bell) whether in the classroom or elsewhere in the school.

Students who choose to bring any personal electronic devices do so at their own risk; South Hills is not responsible for damage, theft, or loss.

The following school consequences will be implemented for electronic device violations:

- 1st Violation - The electronic device will be taken to the attendance office and secured for student pick-up at the end of the school day. Parent/Guardian(s) will be notified via email.
- Future Violations - The electronic device will be taken to the attendance office and secured for parent pick-up. Parents/Guardians will be notified via email. Students that refuse to hand over the electronic device will be subject to additional school consequences.

Chromebooks

It is the student's responsibility to use his/her chromebook for academic purposes only. Chromebooks should be used for schoolwork or to communicate with peers or teachers about schoolwork.

Tips for proper care of a chromebook:

- Keep food and drink away from chromebooks
- Keep the chromebook charged
- Close the lid before carrying a chromebook
- Carry chromebooks with two hands
- Carry the chromebook by its base, not by its screen
- Always place your chromebook on a flat, stable surface
- Store your chromebook in a safe place
- Report damage immediately
- Always keep your assigned chromebook under your supervision

Electronics, Internet and Acceptable Use Policy

Students who use school computers must read and understand the JSD Acceptable Use Agreement. Students and their parent/guardian must sign the agreement before any student can use school computers or chromebooks.

Use of an electronic device (school or personal) to disrupt the educational process, invade personal privacy, or compromise the integrity of educational programs is prohibited. Violations will result in confiscation of the electronic device and may result in the loss of the device or the privilege of bringing the device to school.

Citizenship Grades

Citizenship grades are based on attendance, participation, and behavior. Students are expected to follow the TIGER Traits.

Citizenship Grading Scale

H	The student follows the TIGER Traits and seldom, if ever, violates school and/or class rules, takes correction in a positive and productive way, is willing and eager to improve, and initiates positive contributions to the school and class community; 0-1 infractions
S	The student does not often violate school and/or classroom rules, accepts correction positively, and makes a positive contribution to the school and class community; 2-3 infractions
N	The student sometimes violates school and/or classroom rules, but generally accepts correction positively; 4-6 infractions
U	The student's behavior often has a negative impact on the school and class community; 7 or more infractions

- Citizenship grades can be improved by:
 - Initiating a contract with your teacher, and then
 - Demonstrating 5 consecutive days with zero (0) infractions
- Successful completion of the contract will improve Citizenship grade by one level.
- Serious infractions of the TIGER Traits may result in a complete level drop in Citizenship.
- Students with one or more 'U's or two or more 'N's in a class will not be able to participate in select field trips, school dances, and certain assemblies throughout the year.

Closed Campus

South Hills Middle School is a closed campus. Students are not allowed to leave campus without following proper checkout procedures through the attendance office.

Counseling Center

The Counseling Center is available for the following:

- Academic support
- Class schedules
- Social/emotional wellness
- Home and Hospital information
- Virtual schooling options and resources

Appointments need to be made in advance.

Dangerous Items/Weapons

To maintain school safety, students are prohibited from bringing dangerous items, weapons, or facsimiles of weapons to school. Students who suspect another student has brought or plans to bring a dangerous item or weapon to school have the responsibility to tell an adult immediately.

Any student who accidentally brings a dangerous item to school should bring it to an administrator immediately and not show others.

Digital Citizenship

Be responsible and respectful with what you do on electronic devices. There is no privacy online. Anything you text or post online - words, pictures, or videos - can be viewed by anybody. Only post comments/pictures you would be comfortable showing your parents or guardians.

Cyberbullying is illegal and may result in school and police consequences.

It is against the law for you to bring, possess, share, or show content that involves sexting or pornography while at school, whether in printed manner, on an electronic device, or social media. Consequences for doing so will include parent contact and suspension. Additional consequences may include confiscation of the phone/device, district hearing, and police involvement.

Disrespect and Insubordination

The refusal to follow a reasonable directive by school personnel is considered insubordination and may result in school discipline. Serious or repeated infractions will result in suspension.

Dress Code

Students are expected to dress appropriately for school as outlined in JSD Policy [AA419](#). Students not dressed appropriately will be provided alternate clothing or an opportunity to call home for a change of clothing.

Emergency Drills

Emergency drills are required at regular intervals. When the school is evacuated, students and teachers will follow [Standard Response Protocol](#). Students are expected to remain with their teachers and follow directions.

Fighting

Fighting at school or at school-related activities is prohibited. Students involved are subject to suspension and possible police charges. Provoking, encouraging, or recording a fight will result in school discipline.

Hall Passes

During class time, students are permitted to use the hall pass with the teacher's permission. Teacher discretion will be used in the event of emergencies. Abuse of hall passes or failure to use a hall pass may result in school discipline.

Hallways and Passing Periods

Students are expected to proceed from class to class in a respectful and timely manner. Running, pushing, shoving, throwing objects, public displays of affection, etc., is not permitted. Students should not congregate in hallways, intersections, and bathroom entryways. Misbehavior in the hallways may result in school discipline.

Harassment and Bullying

South Hills is committed to providing a safe and civil school environment in which all members of the school community are treated with dignity and respect. Please see JSD policy [AS98](#) for more information.

Bullying, cyberbullying, or harassment that is found to be targeted as a protected class is prohibited under federal anti-discrimination laws. Please see JSD Policy [AS94](#) for more information.

Serious or repeated infractions will result in suspension.

If you or someone you know are being bullied:

- Tell the individual who is bullying to stop and that the behavior is not wanted.
- Tell a parent or guardian.
- Report incidents to an administrator or a counselor, teacher, hall monitor, school resource officer, and/or SafeUT app

Illegal Drugs, Alcohol, Vaping, and Tobacco

The possession, use, or distribution of illegal drugs, alcoholic beverages, or other prohibited substances constitutes a hazard to students and is disruptive to the educational process. Please see JSD Policy [AS90](#) for more information.

Consequences for AS90 violations will include parent contact, suspension, and other district or school requirements based on severity and number of infractions.

Library / Media Center

Students may check out books in the library. Students are responsible to return books and materials to the library on time. Fines will be assessed for late returns or lost or damaged items. All fine money directly benefits students.

Library Pass

Students are welcome to come to the library during lunch. Students must pick up a pass before lunch, eat lunch in the cafeteria, and then come to the library for the remaining lunch time. No food, drink, or gum is allowed in the library.

Lockers and other School Property

Students are responsible for respecting and maintaining all school property, including textbooks, equipment, desks, chairs, lockers, etc. Students must not write on, scratch, carve, dent, or in any way deface school property. Students who violate these regulations may lose privileges or access and/or make payment sufficient to cover damages or replacement costs. School lockers are property of the school and may be searched.

Loss of Personal Property

Jordan School District and South Hills Middle School are not responsible for personal property that is lost, stolen, damaged or vandalized. There is no provision that allows payment for any personal item that is taken from a student enrolled in the Jordan School District.

Medications/Prescriptions

Students cannot have more than an 8-hour dose of any type of medication for personal use. “Medication” is defined as any over-the-counter pill or personal prescription and must be stored in the original container or package. Do not share medication with anybody at school. Students possessing more than an 8-hour dose and/or sharing prescription or over-the-counter medications with others will be in violation of JSD Policy [AS90](#).

Students needing prescription medication during the school day must provide a completed Request for Medication form from the attendance office. The approved medications are kept in a locked cabinet. Students may have an asthma inhaler with them.

Non-discrimination

South Hills does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, beliefs, national origin, gender, disability, sexual orientation, or gender identity in any educational program or activity.

Non-Educational Items

Any personal item that has nothing to do with the educational process should not be brought to school. Problems arise each year because students bring articles that are hazardous to the safety of others or interfere with the school or educational environment in some way. Items which disrupt the educational environment (i.e. portable speakers, toys, laser pens, cameras, ropes, stink bombs, etc.) will be confiscated.

Profane or Vulgar Gestures, Language, Pictures, or Videos

Gestures, language, pictures, video, etc., that are lewd, vulgar, gross, obscene, defamatory, or otherwise disruptive to the educational environment are inappropriate for any school environment. Infractions may result in school discipline.

Public Displays of Affection

Public displays of affection (such as longer hugs and kissing) are inappropriate at school and school-sponsored activities. Students will be warned for initial violations. Repeated violations will result in parent contact and school discipline.

Report Cards and Mid-Term Progress

Grades are always available on Skyward. Report cards and mid-term reports will not be printed or mailed home. They can be found on Skyward. Official transcripts and report cards may be requested from the counseling center.

Sexual Harassment

Sexual harassment, assault, misconduct/lewdness, or inappropriate sexual behavior at school is defined as “unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and/or other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature that is based on sex, gender, or gender characteristics” towards another person or group. Please see JSD policy [AS94](#) for more information.

When sexual harassment, sexual assault, sexual misconduct, or inappropriate sexual behavior is reported to administration, the report is presented to the Jordan School District Title IX Coordinator. The Title IX Coordinator then determines next steps in the process. Each party involved receives a Title IX notification letter, and school administration offers supportive measures. Additional district and/or school actions are determined throughout the process.

Sick Room

A student who becomes ill during the school day will report to the attendance office with a note from their teacher. When a student arrives, they may be admitted to the sick room. Once in the sick room, the following protocol will be followed:

- Students are assessed by a trained staff member
- After 15 minutes, students will go to class or be encouraged to call home, if necessary
- If a student is too ill to remain at school, parents/guardians will be contacted

In case of an emergency, the paramedics and the student’s parents will be notified

Skateboards, Bikes, and Scooters

Students should walk or carry their skateboard, bike, scooter, etc. when on school property. Serious or repeated violations may include school discipline. Jordan School District and South Hills are not responsible for personal property that is lost, stolen, damaged or vandalized.

Student Clubs, Organizations, and Programs

Students at South Hills Middle School have the opportunity to participate in a variety of clubs, organizations, and programs. Please see the school [website](#) for more information.

Tiger Intervention Room

As part of our school mission to support students in becoming lifelong learners and responsible citizens, South Hills Middle School has created the Tiger Intervention Room (ISS).

When students choose to engage in inappropriate behavior (e.g. accruing tardies, skipping class, or other misconduct), they may be assigned by an administrator to spend time in the Tiger Intervention Room.

Tiger Intervention Room Expectations:

- Turn in personal electronic devices (cell phones, earbuds, etc.)
- Stay awake
- Follow the directions of the Tiger Intervention Room aide
- Complete missing or new schoolwork
- Stay in the room for lunch and passing periods

Fridays will be a self-select day for students to choose to complete work as desired and must be scheduled by an administrator or counselor.

Vending Machines

Vending machines are available and are to be used at students' own risk. South Hills Middle School will not reimburse students for money lost in these machines.

Visitors

- Visitors must report to the main office and sign in.
- Parents must request permission from the administration prior to visiting a classroom during school hours.
